

## **FIRST UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST, Records**

### **BACKGROUND:**

Because of fragmentary and incomplete records, tracing the origins of the First United Church of Christ is a difficult and complicated process. This congregation began with the establishment of two churches; Emmanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church and the Evangelical Congregational Church.

Emmanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church was founded in 1928, when thirty families separated themselves from Peace Lutheran Church of the Ohio Synod, in Tacoma, due to ‘unfortunate relations’ between the pastor and the congregation. These families gathered for their first congregational meeting on December 4, 1928, and voted to meet, on a temporary basis, in a church at 14<sup>th</sup> and M Streets in Tacoma. On August 17, 1929, the newly formed congregation incorporated and elected to build a permanent house of worship at South 23<sup>rd</sup> Street and Cushman in Tacoma. The cornerstone was laid on October 27, 1929. The new church was erected at a cost of \$5,775 and dedicated on January 26, 1930.

Unsuccessful in their efforts to be accepted for membership into the United Lutheran Church, the new congregation voted on August 5, 1930 to join the Evangelical and Reformed Church of North America. This Denomination granted the new church, now named German Evangelical Lutheran Emmanuel Church, liberal financial support and aid and recommended as pastor the Reverend Paul Juelling. Reverend Juelling accepted the call and began his Tacoma ministry on November 6, 1930. The new church prospered and membership ballooned. The members of the congregation quickly created a Sunday school, Senior Women’s Guild (Frauenverein), Young People’s League, and the Junior Women’s Guild (Willing Worker’s Society).

In contrast to Emmanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church, little is written on the early history of Evangelical Congregational Church. This church was founded on August 1, 1920 and chose as pastor the Reverend Julius Hahn. The congregation of Evangelical Lutheran Church also created a Sunday school, clubs, societies, and leagues. Through the 1930s and 40s both churches continued to grow, but this trend did not continue into the 1950s.

In 1956, by sheer luck, the chairmen of both churches met at a polling place and in the course of conversation agreed that they should bring their two struggling congregations together. Joint services, dinners

and meetings were held and proved to be quite successful. This led to the election of temporary officers and the formulation of a program to merge the two churches. Soon after, an exploration committee was elected to draw up the Basis of Union, and this document was promptly ratified by the officers and congregations of both churches.

At approximately the same time as both churches were merging, their parent organizations (the Evangelical and Reformed Church and the Congregational Christian Churches) also merged choosing the name The United Church of Christ. The two newly merged Tacoma churches also adopted this name becoming The First United Church of Christ, Tacoma (the first church in the Washington-North Idaho Conference to do so) on September 22, 1957. The congregation began to prosper and grow. This growth continued until the 1970s, but in the early 1990s the church was closed.

## **SCOPE & CONTENT:**

This collection consists of the fragmentary records of the now defunct First United Church of Christ and its parent congregations; the Evangelical Congregational Church of Tacoma and Emmanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church. These records illustrate the role of German immigrants in Tacoma life and their roles in creating religious institutions. Most of the papers consist of correspondence, financial, membership, and club records. Also contained within this collection are the church's minutes, annual reports, certificates, directories, newsletters, pamphlets, reports and weekly service bulletins. Correspondence records contain a wealth of information including membership changes, financial concerns, committee issues, missionary work, church meetings and services, births, deaths, marriages, club information, and invitations. Many of these same subjects are covered in the minutes and minutes books. The financial records contain information on membership fees, church and club expenditures, collections, fund drives, building funds, reports and the financial secretary's records. Much of this information is also found in the membership records and in the annual reports. The annual reports include information on financial affairs of the congregation, committee and club reports, baptisms, marriages, funerals and the status of various church projects. The certificate files also include information on births, deaths, marriages, and baptisms. Finally, the directory files list the members of the congregation, clubs and organizations, church officers, and health and welfare services

available in Pierce County. Viewed in its entirety, this collection contains a wealth of information on the growth and decline of this congregation founded by German immigrants.
