**PAVOLA, Curt, papers. 10.5 l.f.**

**ABSTRACT:**

Curt Pavola is a human and civil rights activist and advocate, particularly for gay men, lesbian, bisexual and transgender individuals, and is extremely involved in Washington's local and state legislative processes (1980s-present), and statewide advocacy and awareness groups, such as Lavender Pride, Running Proud, Hands Off Washington, and Capital City Pride.

**BACKGROUND:**

Since his college days at Western Washington University (Bellingham) in the early 1980s, Curt Pavola has been actively involved in regional and state politics, both as a vocation and avocation. Concluding his college work in 1985 with a degree in political science and minors in journalism and business administration, Pavola served as a legislative intern to State Senator President Pro Tem Barney Goltz, he assisted the senator with research and constituent relations. That year he also served as a planning intern for the Planning Department of the city of Bellingham, WA, conducting property ownership, utilities, and growth projection research for the city's urban growth area. Pavola completed his master's degree in public administration from The Evergreen State College (Olympia) in 1995.

In 1986, Pavola was hired as a legislative intern by the Association of Washington Cities. He was retained as a staff assistant and was consistently promoted to new duties with the AWC, leaving that organization in 1995 as a Program Coordinator. During his tenure with the AWC, he designed and staffed many workshops for city officials on a wide range of topics. Key areas of focus were city fiscal issues, ADA, the Cable TV Reform Act and general assistance and research on city issues. He staffed numerous committees on municipal policy and a Visioning Committee for Washington cities. Pavola wrote a *Hometown Washington* report on emerging urban issues. He also managed AWC's Election '88 campaign for state and federal races, which involved candidate surveys, issue advocacy, and media outreach. He was chief planner for the Association of Washington Cities annual conference and legislative conference from 1989 to 1995.

Pavola joined the office of the Commissioner of Public Lands at the Washington State Department of Natural Resources in 1995. He worked as Correspondence Analyst (tracking, editing, writing) for the Commissioner, Deputy Commissioner, and the department supervisor (agency director). Other duties included administrative assistance for the Commissioner, constituent relations, and some scheduling, meeting planning, and communications assistance.

He has been deeply involved in civic affairs. He was appointed to Olympia's Solid Waste Advisory Committee (1997) and the city's Utility Advisory Committee (1998). He worked for numerous issue and candidate campaigns, including the Olympia Library Campaign. He frequently testified at public meetings on a variety of community issues, including appearances before the Olympia Planning Commission, Olympia City Council, the community listening session for the Olympia police chief selection process, Timberland Regional Library

Board of Trustees, Thurston County Board of Commissioners, Lacey (WA) City Council, and Thurston Council on Cultural Diversity and Human Rights, as well as legislative hearings. In 1999 he was appointed to the Olympia City Council.

Pavola is best known for his tireless community service advancing social equality and equal rights for affectional minorities (gay men, lesbians, bisexuals), both in Olympia and statewide. In 1992-1993 he served as a member of Washington Governor Mike Lowry's Transition Team Civil Rights Task Force. He was the founder of several groups, including Lavender Action (a statewide education and advocacy organization), Running Proud (recruiting and promoting candidates for public office), Freedom Vote (a candidate interview and endorsement political action committee), and the Gay Men's Social Network (dedicated to community building). He served as a board member of the Washington Freedom Coalition (1992-1993) and was co-chair of the legislative task team for Thurston County Hands Off Washington (1994-1996). He was also at the forefront of the action battling initiatives that sought to limit the rights of gay men and lesbians or restrict equal opportunity for racial minorities and women.

**SCOPE and CONTENT:**

The Curt Pavola collection pertains primarily to Pavola's interest and work in social equality and equal rights for gay men, lesbians, bisexuals, and transgender individuals on the local, state, regional and national level. His involvement and interest in the political and legislative processes and his role in the creation and nurturing of local and statewide advocacy and support groups from the 1980s through the 1990s makes this collection of extreme importance in following and understanding the gay rights movement in the state of Washington during a time when the movement nation-wide was taking on a much more active, out-in-the-open position. He very much was an activist, while at the same time an educator.

Early on, Pavola's correspondence shows a strong commitment on his part to educate both the homosexual and heterosexual communities about homosexuality. He wrote numerous letters to the editors, editorials, articles and press releases giving the most current thinking and understanding about homosexuality. He often included a sheet of terms and definitions, explaining the nuances of terminology and how words were often used in a wrong way to describe homosexuality.

Pavola's extensive correspondence, arranged in a manner consistent with his original file terminology and breakdown, consists of both incoming and outgoing letters, emails, faxes, and organizational mailings. In some cases, organizational material included in the correspondence headings are duplicated in files arranged by the name of the organization, in particular Lavender Pride, Hands Off Washington, and Running Proud.

Correspondents include fellow state of Washington activists Bill Dubay (Seattle), founding member and treasurer of Bigot Busters and campaign manager for several candidates; Richard Kirton (Kent), a board member of Washington Citizens for Fairness – Hands Off Washington and co-founder and co-director with Pavola of Lavender Action; Anna Schlecht (Olympia), co-chair of Thurston County Hands Off Washington; and Ric Leonetti (Vancouver), publisher and editor of the *Vancouver Voice* and media chair for Evergreen AIDS Response. He also maintained written contact with many state and federal legislators, including Senator Ed Murray (D – Seattle), Representative Cal Anderson (D – Seattle) and U.S. Congresswoman Jolene Unsoeld.

The files labeled Articles and Editorials contain many of the writings of Curt Pavola. Some are letters to the editors in which Pavola is taking issue or supporting current news topics and stories. Others are his more in-depth essays that were meant to be editorials in newspapers throughout the state. Also included are some of his educational writings helping both the homosexual and heterosexual communities become more familiar with homosexuality, including research, contemporary thinking, and definitions. Other work relates his educational efforts to contemporary issues and his concern for human equality.

Pavola's involvement in the creation and continued work of several state organizations, in particular Lavender Pride, Running Proud, Capital City Pride (Olympia, WA), and Washington Citizens for Fairness / Thurston County Coalition / Equality Washington's Hands Off Washington is evident in several different sections of the collection. Material on Pavola's and the organizations' activities can be found in general correspondence, correspondence specific to the organizations, and under the name of each organization.

Lavender Action served as a public information organization reporting on how state senators and representatives voted on key state legislation affecting the civil rights of Washington citizens. It was a non-partisan, non-profit educational and advocacy organization working toward equality in basic civil rights for gay men, lesbians, bisexuals, and transgender individuals. For several sessions, they issued legislative report cards detailing each legislator's voting record along with a synopsis of each bill being considered.

Running Proud was founded in 1994 as a campaign to include lesbian and gay voices in public dialogue. Its mission was "To assure that the political dialogue...includes gay men and lesbian voices talking about 'our issues,' while also reflecting the rich diversity of opinions and backgrounds that exists among affectional minorities." In 1994 their goals were to encourage gay men, lesbians, bisexual men and women, and transgendered people to run for political office in as many areas of the state of Washington as possible; dispel the many stereotypes that were being cultivated by the proponents of the anti-civil rights initiatives (Initiatives 608 and 610); and establish the expectation that gay people will stand up and defend their rights, and that they are willing to be part of their community's governance in an open and educational manner. In 1995 they expanded their goals to include providing information, advice, and connections to other resources regarding the formation and operation of campaigns for elective offices.

Hands Off Washington (HOW) was initiated in 1994 by the Washington Citizens for Fairness in order to oppose Lon Mabon and his anti-gay campaign in Washington. HOW was successful in preventing Initiative 608 and 610 from being placed on the election ballot. In 1995, HOW again successfully rallied state-wide support to prevent Initiatives 166 and 167 from being placed on the ballot. The next year HOW fought an anti-gay agenda in the state legislature and again was successful in seeing that none of the measures being considered were enacted into law. Legislation proposed during the 1996 session included an attempt to make it impossible for gay men, lesbians, bisexuals, and transgender people to provide adoptive or foster homes to children in need. Another bill would have declared that marriage in Washington was for the sole purpose for procreation and would have prevented the state of Washington from recognizing the marriages of same gender couples even if those marriages were legally performed in another state. In a broader sense, Hands Off Washington was an organization developed to help defend basic rights and fairness and to help defeat discrimination.

The Thurston County Coalition Council worked in collaboration with Washington Citizens for Fairness – Hands Off Washington to counter attacks to civil rights at the grassroots level. The group focused on Thurston County, the seat of state government. Their goal was to educate Thurston County residents about discriminatory initiatives and to encourage their help in defeating those measures. Curt Pavola was an active participant and leader.

Included in the files relating to Lavender Action, Running Proud, Hands Off Washington and other similar organizations are newsletters, fliers, correspondence, committee notes, campaign materials, and media and constituent mailings, faxes and emails.

The collection also contains various articles and reports, both state and national, regarding gay / lesbian issues; brochures, pamphlets, newsletters, newspapers, and other publications from both state and national gay / lesbian organizations; and extensive files of clippings, filed under the main heading of Issues. Scattered throughout the collection is correspondence and printed material reflecting right-response to various causes in which Pavola was involved. The Issues files are arranged in chronological order for general issues, and by specific topical issues for those files for which Pavola had specifically named. The newsletter and newspaper component is a good representative example of the communication efforts of various organizations and groups throughout the state of Washington interested in gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender issues.
