Donald Pugnetti Papers

BIOGRAPHY

Donald Pugnetti was born on April 18, 1917 in Carbonado, Washington to Antonio and Mary Pugnetti. Spending much of his childhood in Tacoma, where he attended Lincoln High School, Pugnetti graduated from the University of Washington in 1941 with a journalism degree. After having worked as a reporter for the *Tacoma News Tribune* (TNT) and an editor for the Seattle Chamber of Commerce's newsletter *Seattle Business* in 1945-47, Pugnetti landed a job as an editor for the *Tri-City Herald* (TCH) in Pasco, Washington. While working for the *Herald*, Pugnetti tirelessly lobbied for a facility designed to convert steam waste from the Hanford Nuclear Plant into electricity, a stance for which he received the Thomas Stokes Award for Journalism in 1963. In 1973, Pugnetti returned to Tacoma to work for TNT as Editor, a position he held until retiring in 1985. He died a year later in 1986. Pugnetti's wife, Frances, chronicled her husband's life as a journalist in the book, *Tiger By The Tail*.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The papers of Donald Pugnetti cover the years 1937 to 1986 and include correspondence, legal briefs, legislative reports, memoranda, newsletters, newspaper clippings, photographs, programs, publications, speeches, and subject files. The subject files contain a mixture of correspondence, memoranda, newspaper clippings, and printed materials arranged by topic, person, or organization

The correspondence dates from 1937 to 1985, focusing mostly on the years 1973 to 1985, and primarily documents Pugnetti's daily involvement as editor of the *Herald* and *Tribune*, handling reader response to stories and editorials, invitations to community events-meetings and banquets, and interest in employment or internships with the newspaper. Correspondents include: Congressman Norm Dicks, John McCallum, Senator Warren Magnuson, and Hu Blonk of the *Wenatchee World*.

Files organized by Pugnetti as Editor of the TCH pertaining to procedural and structural matters at the *Herald*, regional issues in transportation-culture-and the economy, lawsuits faced and filed by the *Herald*, professional contacts with other journalists and politicians, and personal involvement in community groups and business. Among the topics addressed in these files include Pugnetti's active lobbying for the construction of a power plant at Hanford to generate energy from steam waste and the Stokes Journalism Award he won for his pro-steam plant editorials. While much of the original order of these files has been retained in the course of the processing of this collection, some files have been consolidated and re-described for the purposes of clarification.
